

Trusting in God's mercy, let us confess our sin.


We kneel or stand. Silence is kept for reflection.


Holy One, source of our renewal,

First Reading


1 Samuel 3: 1-10 The calling of Samuel

¹Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; ³the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. ⁴Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" ⁵and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. ⁶The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." ⁷Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. ⁸The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. ⁹Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'" Second Reading

1 Corinthians 6:12-20 Glorify God in your body

¹²"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are beneficial. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be dominated by anything. ¹³"Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food," and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is meant not for fornication but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. ¹⁴And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. ¹⁵Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Should I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! ¹⁶Do you not know that whoever is united to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For it is said, "The two shall be one flesh." ¹⁷But anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. ¹⁸Shun fornication! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body; but the fornicator sins against the body itself. ¹⁹Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the

Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? ²⁰For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body.

Creating Healthy Congregations

On January 27, the first Healthy Congregations Workshop will take place at our Church. The purpose of this program is to help grow thoughtful leaders as well as to strengthen faith communities. As you may have read in the January Messenger, there are up to six workshops that may be offered to our congregation.

The tentative schedule is as follows:

8 AM: Open for participants to register (registration is free) and continental breakfast.

9AM: Workshop begins

10:30: Break

10:45: Program continues

12:30 Lunch (provided by Parish Life)

1:15 PM Program continues

3:30 PM Program concludes

Each workshop is made up of five sessions, and each session lasts for about 60 minutes. The total time for a Workshop is about 5 hours. Workshop One is entitled: "Creating Healthy Congregations" and is the initial workshop. The other workshops can be done in order or juggled in their sequence. Pastor Dana and the Council feels that this program has the potential to enable greater engagement, communication, and spiritual growth, individually as well as throughout the congregation.

The intention is to offer the first workshop to our congregation, and depending on the response and evaluation by attendees, to either continue the series, or to conclude the program. Because the Parish Life committee will be preparing a breakfast and lunch for the participants, we would like to have members of the congregation register (registration is free) prior to the event. As such, a sign-up sheet will be placed in the Narthex on the table before entering the sanctuary beginning Sunday, January 7th.

We know that a commitment to attend a workshop for a 5-hour session is a big deal, but we trust the investment of time will be worthwhile. On behalf of the Council we hope that you will check your schedule, and if possible block this time off to attend this program.
